Kaore paid his tax to the Honohiki, several months, instead of working for the Poalima. When Kaore was put out of office, the kals on these lois was sold at auction to pay his debts. I do not think Kaalemakule ever planted at all in any of these lois. After Kaore left Hawaii, I took possession of the land as Honohiki under Kanoa. Witness declares that he gave the land to Claimant directly after the great freshet at Koloa about the year 1846 & he has had peaceable possession of it ever since -

Leoi witness, Sworn, says he knows the land of Clt. that at the time of the great freshet the lots were ruined by the water that the former occupant abandoned the land that Claimant reformed the lots & has occupied them ever since with the approbation of the Kauhiki & without opposition from any source -

Koloa Oct. 3. 1854.

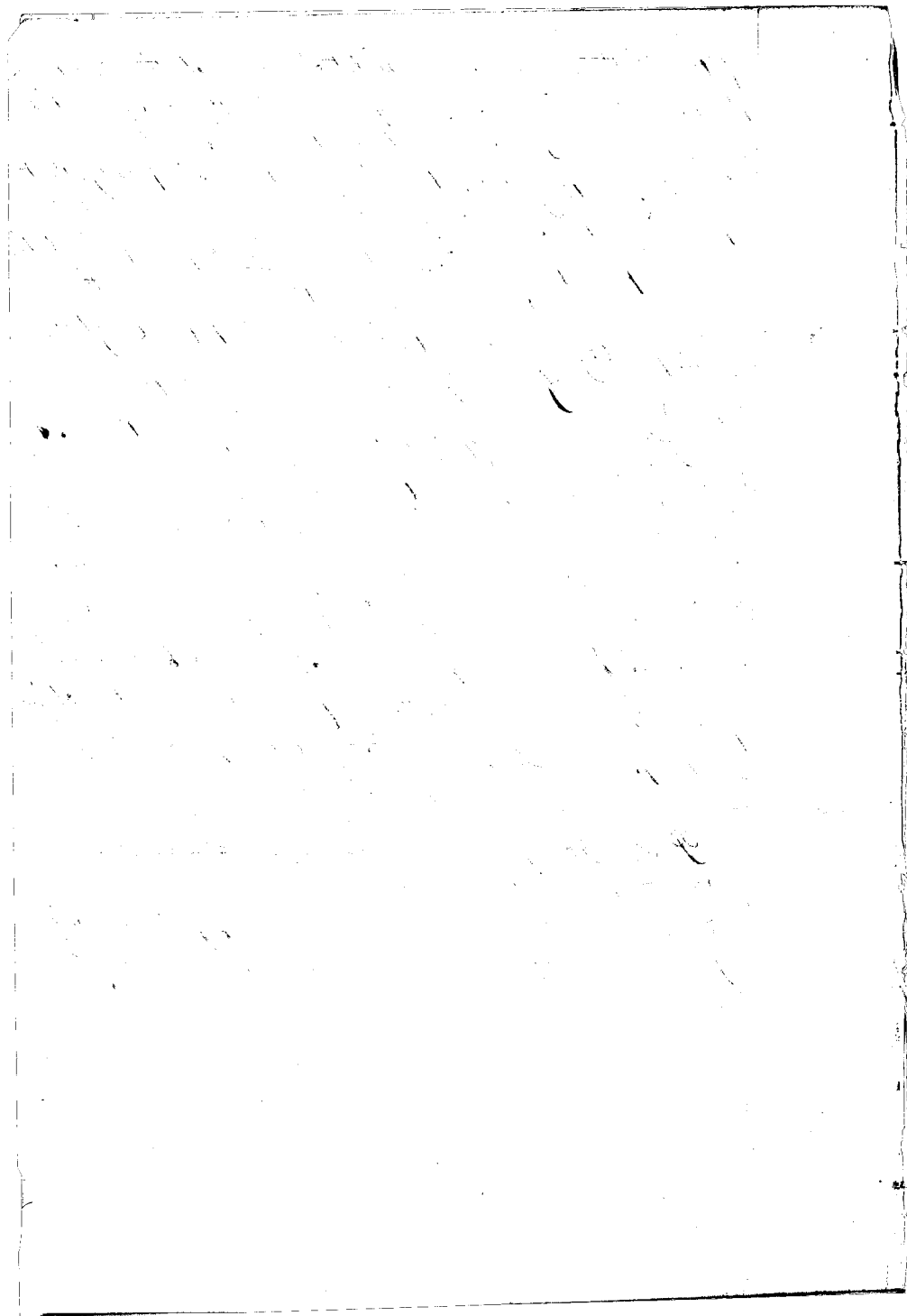
The accompanying testimony in relation to the Land of Sabatila needs a little explanation - By referring to evidence in the class of Pucana No 10675 you will find that it was included in the claim

of the latter, - Pucaina & Salititela are relatives & at the time their claims were presented both occupied the same house Pucaina had all the land included in his claim, they both believing in their simplicity, that it was just as well to have both lands included in one palapala - In the native copy of the testimony, which I have, I find the l^os of Salititela are expressly mentioned. (I have not the English copy).

When Mr Pease surveyed the land of Pucaina he left out the land of Salititela, as it was evident that did not belong to him, - Pucaina has received his award - but Salititela loses his land unless this correction be made.

You will observe therefore that the claim of S. is not a new claim - what is requested is a rectification of an error in the claim N^o 10675 - Not doubting but you will give the case due consideration.

P. S. If your Commission conclude to allow Salititela his land it will be necessary to have it surveyed - Mr. Pease, I suppose, is at Honolulu, though he makes frequent visits to Kauai.



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Evidence from Mr. Powell December 23rd 1854

Honolulu Dec. 21st 1854.

Dear Sir:

I have found the aw^d of Ula
10922 No 10922 x9799. It is receipted by Kikaulahas the re-
ceiving date Aug. 27. 1852.

As you do not mention the names of the ³ aw^d
sent in the package with Nahi's I cannot certainly
say whether I have rec^d them or not. But I rec^d ³ aw^d
months since 3 awards one of which was Kapehu's,
the others I do not remember. Nahi's was not one of
them. They came entirely loose, without a particle
of wrapper or even a string around them; & without
any note accompanying. They had passed through
several hands having been handed over from one na-
tive to another until they finally reached me, so
far as I could learn, Kikaulahas had given ^{them}
into the hands of some native on board the steam
Otoromoi, with verbal instructions to deliver or send
them to me. I herewith send you surveys for 8 of
the 10 whose names you mention as having been reported
by Mr. Pease to have abandoned their claims. Of the
other 2, Kuleiki (wrongly written Kuleiki) has already
received his award, the other Kiholelilo has given
up his land to Kahohe who has got the award

of it, I also send you the disavowal of 4 of them over
their own signatures, that they have ever abandoned their
claims. I left Waimea before having received the disavowal
of others, but it will be forwarded to me here probably that
of Kulumane. I could not get as he was absent from the place.

But Mr. P. surveyed his claim & rec^d 3 dollars in
full for the survey, & as to Pahupuu, I now perceive
that I have forgotten to give him notice that he must
make a disavowal. But the Koroahiki does not even
pretend that any one of them had ever given up his
claim.

I also send you surveys of the house lots of
Kapa Kapa 11277 & Naiaikamannu 11278, which should be
added to what has already been awarded them, I
also send you 5 other surveys viz.

Hulimai 6531. There is one taropatek in this land
which is claimed by the Koroahiki as a koele. But the
former Koroahiki tells me that it is not properly a koele,
that he took it & planted it id a koele once or twice,
but it was not originally so, & has never been used
as such since. It has certainly never been used as
such since it came in possession of Hulimoi & for
years previous. I suppose you will find the evidence
which I took down. If so, then the title of Hulimoi
is good. I think, to the whole as I have surveyed it.

Manini 6678. This piece of land is additional
to what has already been awarded to Manini. The
Koroahiki objected to Mr. P. surveying it on the ground
that the land did not belong properly to Manini
but to Kumeua. But Kumeua is Manini's father or
uncle & they live together & occupy jointly the land,
& they mutually agreed that the land should be claimed
in Manini's name, & as de Fivas, & the evidence was
taken in Manini's favor by the mutual agreement of them
both, & it seems to me that the mere absence of Kumeua's
name in the original claim or evidence should not in-
validate the title. So Mr. Lee decided when he was

Kiko 6268. This is a resurvey of Kiko's land, Mr. P. survey included one ~~two~~ patch which belonged to Daniela (Clew). This patch I have left out making Kiko's land in 2 parts. Daniela also claims one of the patches which I have included in this survey, I have thoroughly examined his claim & am satisfied that it is wholly groundless, Kiko's right to this patch is precisely the same in every respect as it is to the rest of her land; she received it at the same time & has always cultivated & used it wholly for herself precisely as her other patches; The rest of this group "Tiaruahie" belong to Daniela. He says he put in a claim to it, & that the evidence was taken at Waialeale. If so, I do not see why he is not entitled to an award. If it is only for want of the survey, that the award is not given, then please let me know, & I will survey it. I think no one will contest his claim.

10953

Wewew 10953. This also is a resurvey & should be substituted for the original one awarded to him. That survey of Mr. P.'s is certainly a remarkable one; It professes to be a survey in 2 parts, of his purchase, two land & Kula. But neither of those parts, according to the boundaries these laid down, included any portion of the house - lot or one inch of two land. They include only waste land which I have left out entirely. I have laid down the survey where it ought to be, covering Wewew's house - lot & the land which he cultivated.

With the exception of this last & the claims of Mianini & Pahupuu, the Honolulu's luna went with me & was present when I made the surveys of all the claims mentioned above, & no exceptions were taken by him to any of the boundaries as I have given them, but what I have already mentioned above. I also explained fully to him what I ^{had} in regard to Mianini's & Wewew's claim, & he expressed a full consent & approval of my work. To the boundaries of Pahupuu's land there can be no possible objections by any one.

Wahapuu's survey also I send you. This is a good

of clear claim, was omitted by Mr. Pease, probably through
mistake. As I am now in Koloa for a few days, I
will attend to the claim which you mentioned. The one
in Hanapepe which I mentioned as requiring a new
survey I have not yet been able to attend to.

For the surveys of the recent claims, i.e. those
on which the evidence was recently taken I have charged
the individual claimants \$5. each, & you will not include
the cost of survey in the costs of my award on the
awards. But for the previous claims I have made
no charge, & you can do as you think proper about in-
cluding in the costs any charge for surveys. I suppose
there are some other claims mentioned in my earlier
notes of evidence, which have never been surveyed.

Two only have come to my knowledge. One is
that of Kapuniia for Waiahole, an ili in Waianai.
I supposed his claim was good to that land & do not
know whether it has been brought before the commission
or not. Another is that of Namiofiahaku. One
person of the same name has received an award.

Send survey of a house lot of about which
Mr Pease refused to survey, joining the lot which
Mr P. surveyed for him who chose to pass his
boundary line close by the house so as to leave
out the Garden, rather than go round the house
to give him his due - though but a few minutes
labor - It belongs to Tapohatapu from ancient
times - & there is not the slightest ground for
opposing the claim.

I am told that Mr Pease refused
to survey the house lots of nearly all the Claimants
in the Valley of Wairawa & it is the opinion
of the natives that he was bribed to do so
by the Ranahatu. I have no time to attend
to those lots, though pressed to do so by the
people - & I fear they must be deprived of
them.

Dear Sir
I send you a survey of Keia Rata's house
lot - the lot N^o 2 which has been awarded to him
4595 is the same as that awarded to Pua Rata 4595
& belongs to Pua Rata - By comparing the 2 surveys
made by Mr Pease you will see that they are

both on the same spot - only a little variation in the course
I have surveyed for Kapelue the lot which his house lot
stands has always stood. I cannot see how Mr P.
can have made the blunder. I send also the Award
of Kapelue to be corrected.

I return also the Award of Tona Kamoohipaka
3587-6752 with a resurvey of No 2 lot in that
Award - Mr P. left out of that piece a large part
of one Kalo patch without any good reason - as it belongs
to Tona underfoot.

In survey of the above I discovered that Mr P.
has also cut off a large slice of ~~the~~ ^{the} ~~lot~~ ^{lot} No 7672
lot No 1 - he gives the names of N & S boundaries,
correctly - but his survey makes the width much
narrower than it really is - It all belongs to
Kauai - neither he nor the Honolulu nor any one
else was aware that it was not all included in the
survey - I therefore return the Award with a resurvey
of that piece.

I send also the Award of Maui 8035-10258 -
with the resurvey of Court Case (objected to by Kauai)
Kauai to whom you saw at Honolulu is not the owner
of the illi "Houla", where Maui's & Mamoo's lands
are all situated - but he is son-in-law to the true
owner - Kanae - who was present when I made the
survey. I saw the deed, I am quite confident that
Kanae & not Kauai, was the purchaser. I have
however seen Kauai since his return & heard all his
objections to the claim. He enquired my reasons for

enlarging the survey - I told him I found from
 unanimous witnesses on the spot that that portion
 (I added) had always belonged to Alai Ri - and he
 stated by him - I still so that his claim was
 just as good & the same in all respects as the
 part awarded - To this Kanai made an objection
 - I perceived no objection he made lay against
 the addition which I had made to the survey -
 but only that Alai Ri had too much land -
 2nd that he had land in two different places,
 in the valley - 3rd that some of the large patches
 in Opepu (X-1) did not belong to him but
 to a man named Koa - I replied that a just right
 and not how many, or different places, was the question -
 Kanai admitted that he could not disprove Alai Ri's
 right - the lots did belong to him - but he thought
 it was more than he ought to have.

To the 3rd objection - I replied that as shown two
 patches of Koa were as he said near the S boundary
 of the land, they were not in the part I had added,
 but in the original survey by Mr. Pease which had
 already been awarded - that such an objection was
 never before made to any one - nor to Mr. Pease - & when
 I was on the ground, neither Kanai, nor any other there,
 knew of any large patches in all that land (Opepu) that
 did not belong to Alai Ri - but that Kanai told me
 expressly that he had no dispute with Alai Ri about
 his claim. He agreed to bring his witnesses by the
 10th Inst unless he found Koa had cotted those
 patches with Alai Ri's permission - in which case

he should drop the objection & write me a note.

This has not been done - & I conclude I shall hear
no more from him.
